ILLINOIS SOLDIERS' AND SAILORS' HOME, QUINCY, ILL.

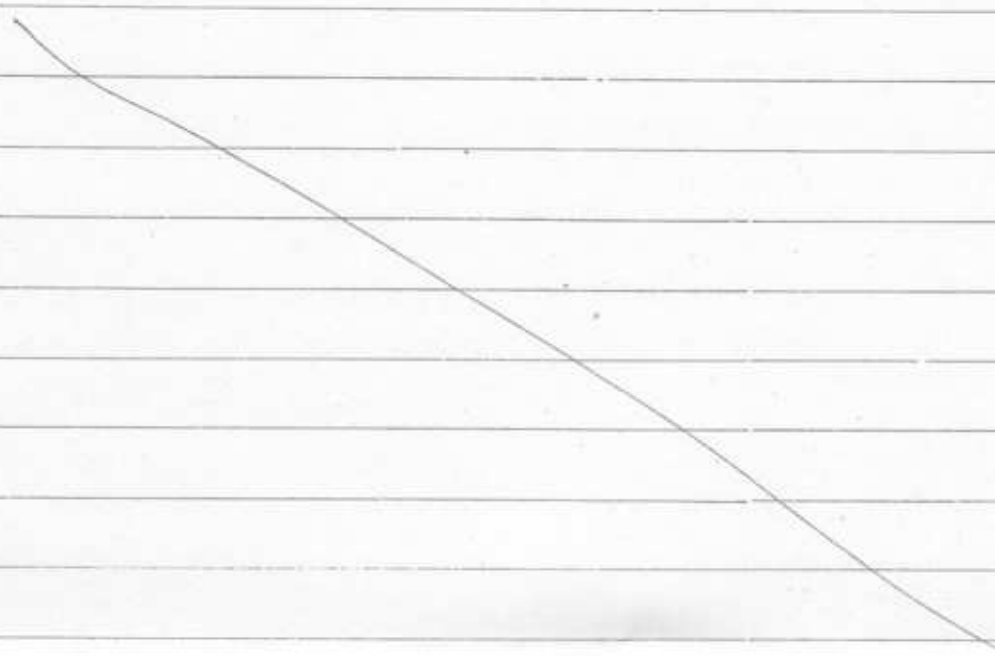
IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN.

I, Patrick B Fishback of Illinois Soldiers' and Sailors' Home in the County of Adams and State of Illinois, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do, therefore, make, ordain, publish and declare, this to be my last, Will and Testament.

First. I order and direct that my Execut<sup>r</sup> or hereafter named, pay all my just debts and funeral expenses as soon after my decease as conveniently may be.
